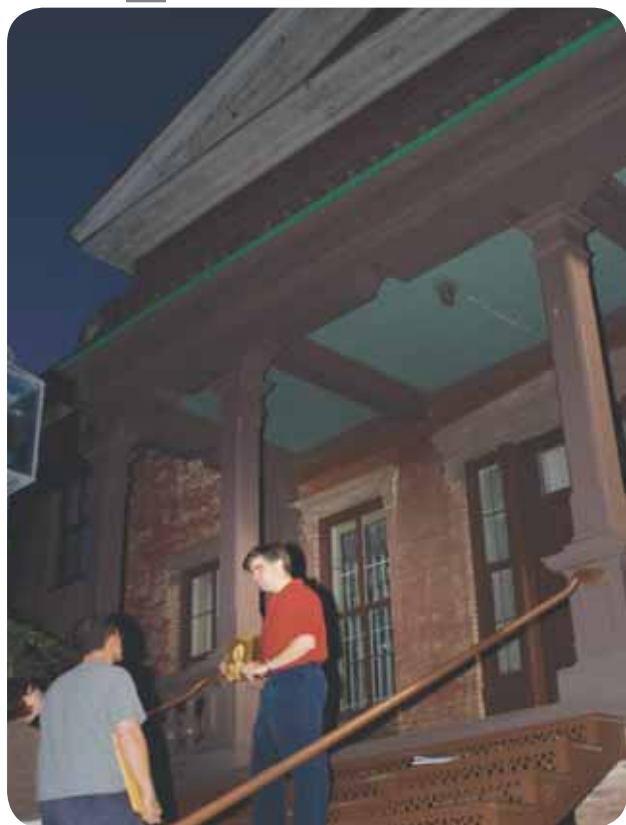


Capital Pride's Halloween Party: Nightmare on P Street.
