Eastern HS Modernization Plans Raise Concerns

In late 2008, the Office of Public Education Facilities Management (OPEFM) issued a RFP to modernize the historic Eastern Senior High School building; an award announcement was planned for Jan. 2. Eastern's School Improvement Team (SIT) – the conduit for school and neighborhood modernization input – had not yet been convened. Despite months of promises, DCPS had not begun public planning for a new academic program to be implemented after the current program is phased out. As of late December, DCPS could say only that it “plans to host an academic planning meeting for Eastern in late January,” followed by convening a SIT. The People's Inaugural Project

Earl Stafford, the founder of Unitech, a Centerville technology company, took advantage of a one million dollar inaugural package offered by the JW Marriott. As one of the prime locations in the District (1331 Pennsylvania Ave. is on the presidential parade route), the package includes 300 rooms, four suites and \$200,000 worth of food and drink. The three-day extravaganza includes a Prayer Breakfast (1,000 expected), Martin Luther King Luncheon (1,000 expected), Youth Ball (300 expected) and the People's Inaugural Ball (1,000 expected) with hopes that President Obama will attend. It was a family affair when Mr. Stafford and his wife, Amanda, and his children (Mark, Jessica Davis Stafford and Earl Jr.), made the announcement at a press conference. Mr. Stafford, one of 12

children of a Baptist minister, said that "God moved him" to do what he is doing. A cross section of people, including the disadvantaged, the physically challenged, the homeless, veterans and those on active duty in the military, are expected to attend. This wonderful gift also includes lodging for three days, food, make-up sessions, gowns and tuxedos for those who cannot afford it.

Shell Gas Station Application Denied

The District Department of Transportation Public Space Committee unanimously voted on Dec. 18 to deny the public space application DAG Petroleum submitted for a Shell gas station at 1400 Maryland Ave. NE. (For more background, see the Hill Rag September 2008.) ANC 6A06 Commissioner Bill Schultheiss reported on his single member district's listserv that the committee was impressed by the large numbers of public

comments submitted opposing the use of public space for the operation of a gas station. In rendering their opinion, they left open the door for the company to redesign the site, but supported the ANC and neighborhood position that public space not be used for operations necessary to the running of a gas station such as parking, queuing and circulating to the gas pumps.

"This is a huge victory for the H Street and the neighborhood. We owe a great deal of gratitude to Council Members Wells, Cheh, and Brown for their support in addition to their able staff," said Schultheiss. "I also want to state this would not have been possible without the support of a great many people who volunteered lots of time researching the regulations and organizing the neighborhood with the Shell-no campaign."
